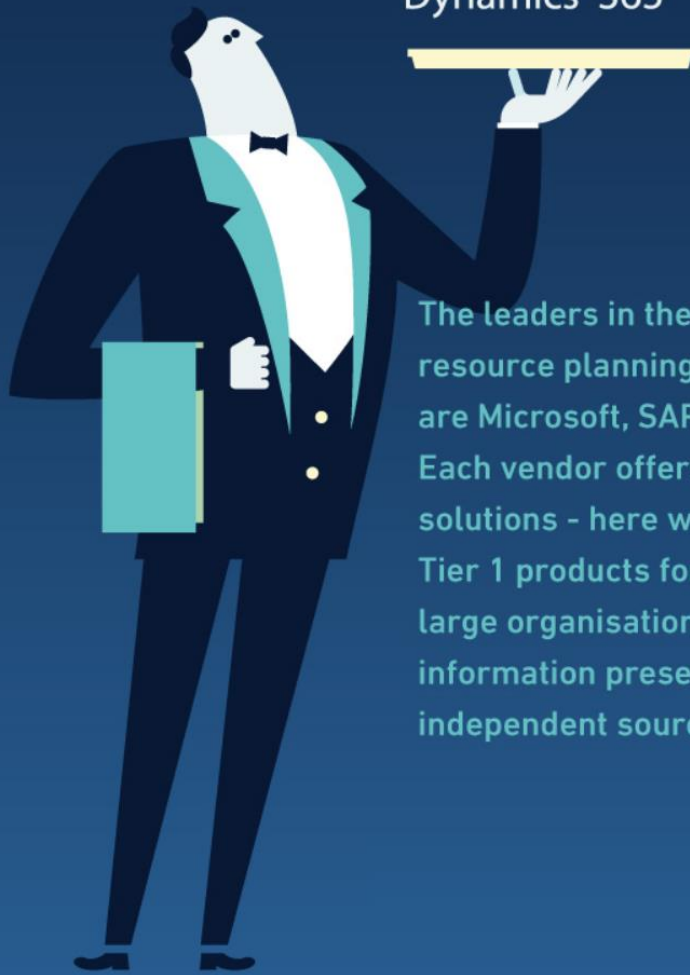

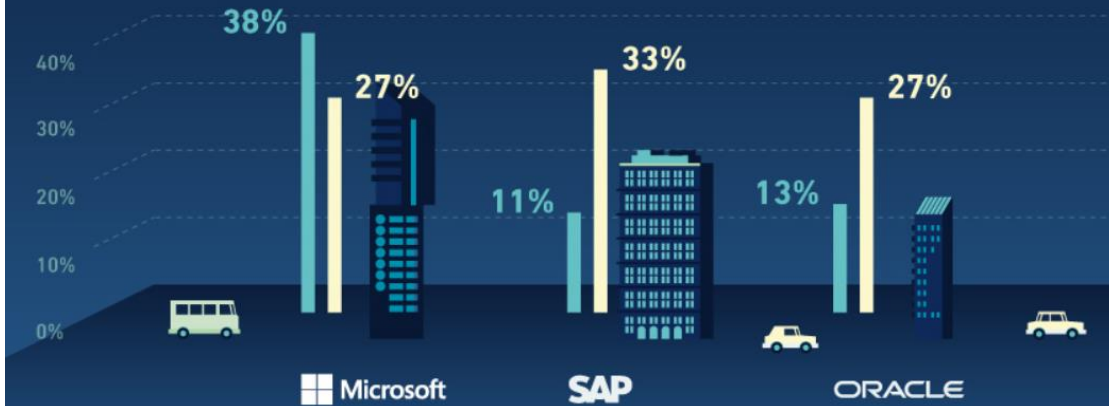

ERP vendors by market share

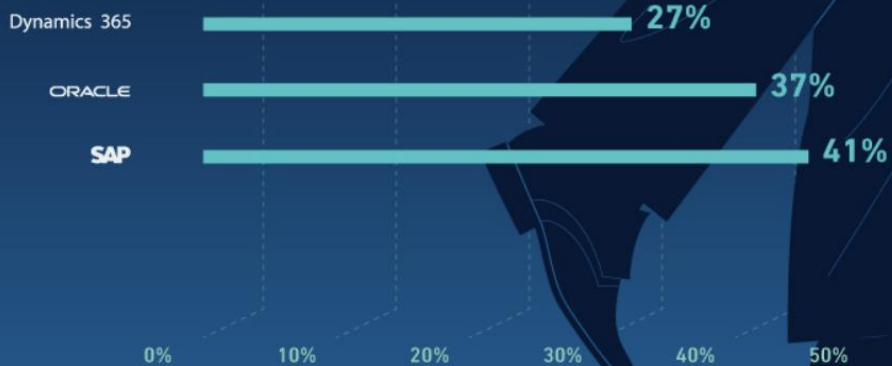

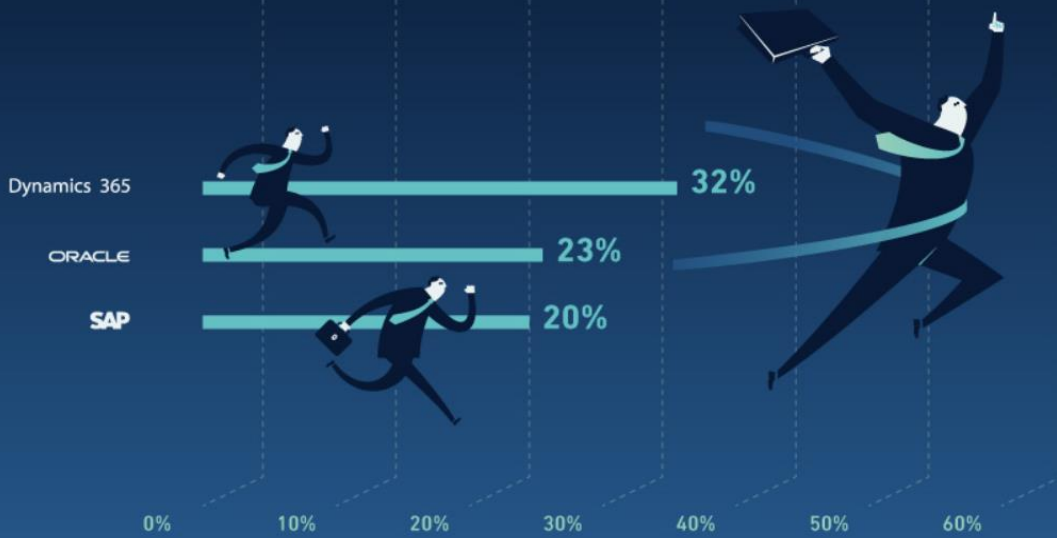
Most frequently shortlisted

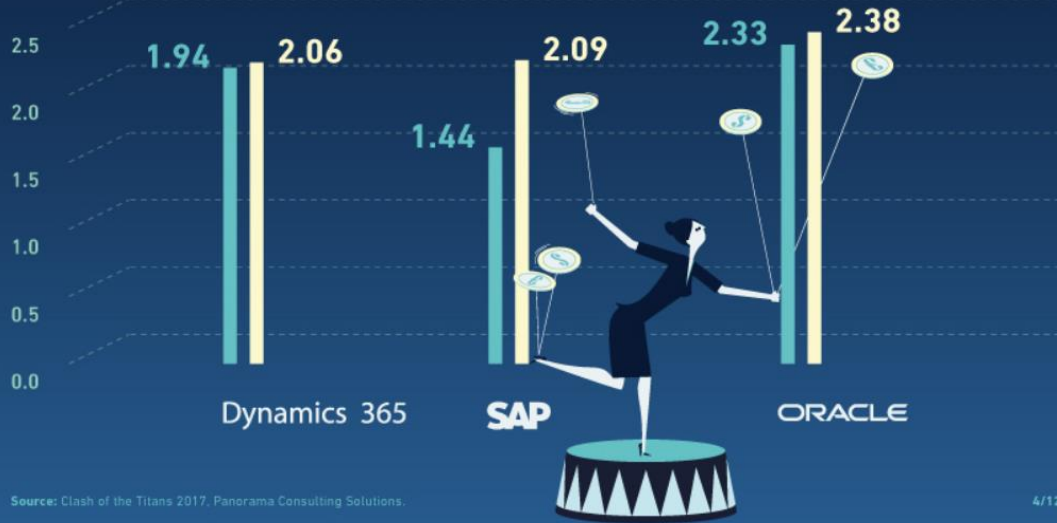

The greater the difference between planned and actual costs indicates the predictability of ROI.

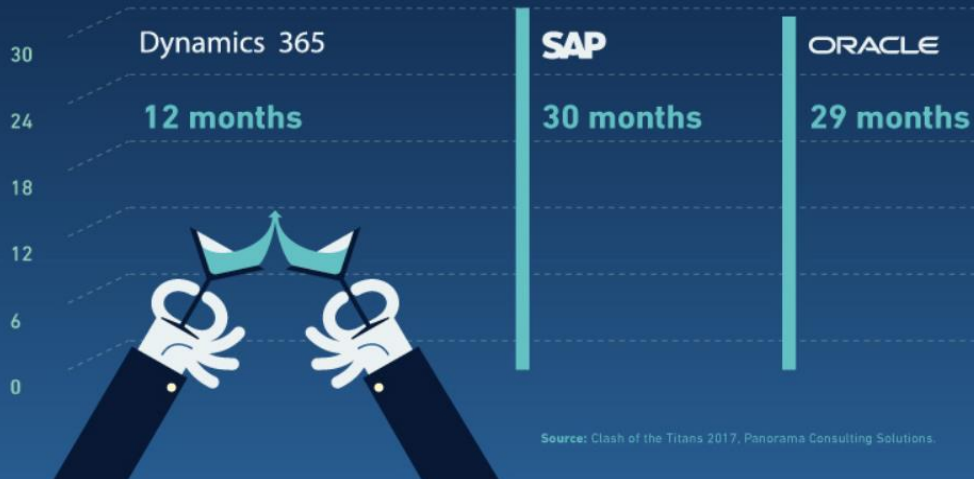

Payback is defined as the point in time when the organisation recoups its initial investment.



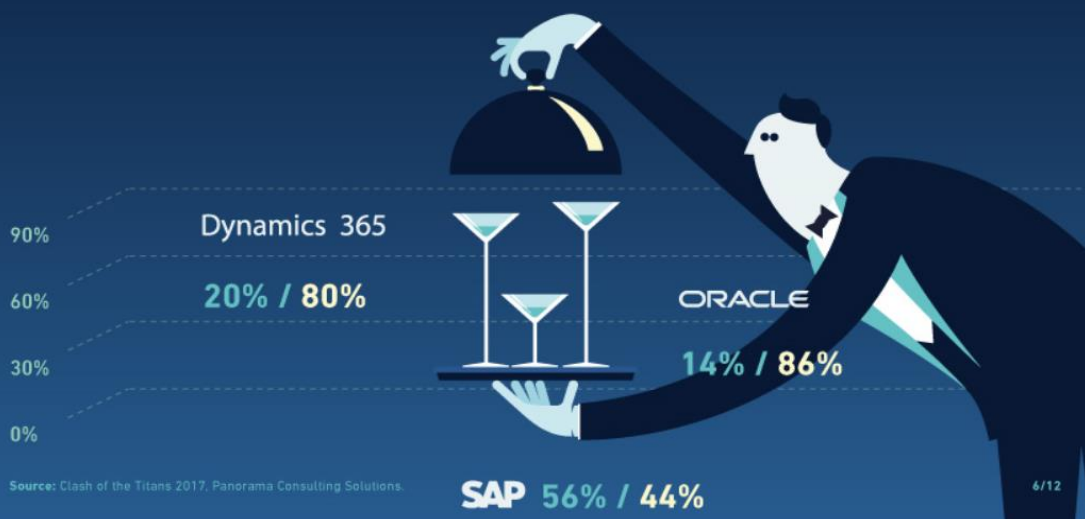

The take-up of functionality often relates to the overall ease of use.



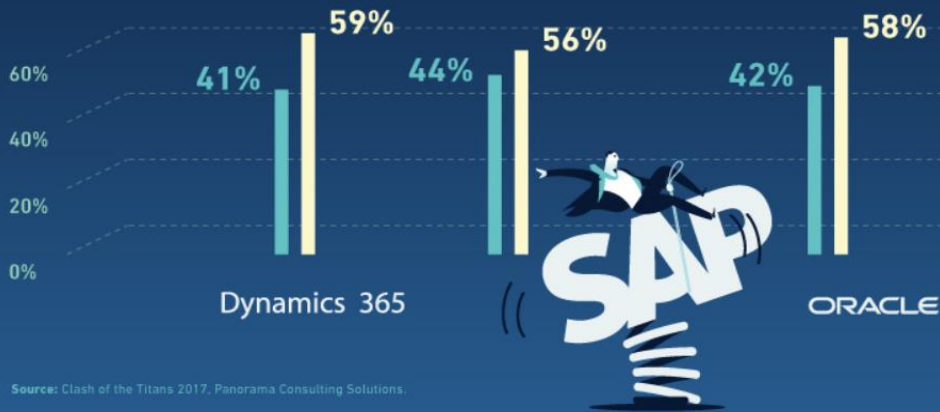
